

Capital Soccer Coaching Contract

Coaches in the Capital Soccer Club work closely with children – our society’s most important resource. The youth players on Capital Soccer Club teams must have a great soccer experience on and off the field, or the Club will (and should) fail. While the Club exists for the players, the club is operated by its coaches. Their participation in training, Club fund-raising, and in guiding the Club are essential for the player’s to have excellent instruction, uniforms, equipment, tournament fees, and a strong Club program in which to play. Each Capital coach has to participate in *all* of the activities of the Club and meet *all* of the requirements of the Club.

Code of Conduct

Coaching in the club is a privilege and a coach can be suspended from the Club or dismissed for failure to comply with the following mandates:

A coach shall develop soccer skills and also the fundamentals of fair play and good sportsmanship throughout their team.

A coach shall serve as a role model of sportsmanship and fairness in their behavior, dealings with other coaches, and in their interaction with spectators.

A coach will always place the good of the player ahead of their own good.

A coach shall not violate League, Association, or Tournament codes of conduct or behavior

A coach shall not act in any fashion that brings disrepute upon a player, a team, the Club, our community, or the sport

The head coach is responsible for his assistants, parents and players. He will be responsible for their actions and held accountable for such actions.

Coach Participation in Club Activities and Continuing Education

A coach may be suspended or dismissed from the Club for failing to complete the following requirements:

1. A Capital coach, assistant or team representative shall attend 75% of Capital monthly meetings.
2. Support all Capital fundraising activities including all tournaments.
3. Obtain an E license within the first year of coaching and a minimum of a D license to travel with teams out of state.
4. Pay league and Club dues in a timely manner

5. Coach in a manner that is acceptable to Carson City youth and Capital Soccer Club.
6. Support and attend Club training sessions
7. Take care of and maintain all Capital equipment and property

Suspension, Dismissal, and Due Process

At the board's discretion and by a majority vote, a coach may be suspended from membership and participation in the Capital Soccer Club. Upon suspension the Coach will be replaced and may not participate in any further activities with the Club until the end of the season in which the suspension occurred, or if it occurred between seasons, until the end of the immediately following season. The suspended coach will return all Club equipment and any forms of identification or affiliation with the Club (e.g., coach passes from a league).

A suspended coach may petition, in writing, to be reinstated in the following season. Reinstatement shall be based upon a majority vote by eligible voting members of the Club. The Club president shall break all tie votes.

A coach may be dismissed from the Club after suspension. Dismissal from the Club differs from suspension in that the coach may not petition the Club for reinstatement at any time. Dismissal may occur at any time during a period of suspension upon a majority vote by eligible voting members of the Club. The Club President shall break all tie votes.

Due Process

Participation in Capital Soccer Club is voluntary, and by asking to be a participant, the Coach agrees to follow the processes stated above.
